2025 INTERNATIONAL PRE-ORIENTATION LEADER APPLICATION

The International Student Pre-Orientation (ISP) is a week-long program specially designed to welcome international students. As you might remember, the first few days and weeks on campus—especially in a new country—can be overwhelming. The purpose of ISP is to give international students a chance to recover from their long journeys, acquaint themselves with Smith, and learn how to fully benefit from the United States' educational system. ISP also provides entering international students an opportunity to get to know one another and discuss the upcoming excitement and challenges of college life here.

ISP 2025 will take place from **Sunday, August 24 to Thursday, August 28.** Training for ISP leaders will take place from **Thursday, August 21 to Saturday, August 23.** Qualified students are invited to apply to be an ISP leader, guiding the international students of the Class of 2029 through their first days on campus and in the US. Housing and meals will be provided to leaders during the training and following program, and each leader will receive a \$650 stipend.

In order to apply, a student must be:

- 1. An enrolled student for the 2025-26 academic year
- 2. In good academic standing (C average or better) as defined in the Smith College catalogue.
- 3. Able to attend training sessions on campus prior to the beginning of ISP, starting the evening of **Thursday**, **August 21, 2025.** (Leaders will be able to move into their houses that day).
- 4. Able to demonstrate active involvement and contribution to Smith campus community and/or international student life.
- 5. **Free from other responsibilities or training sessions during the training and ISP programs.** This means students **cannot** jointly participate in ISP and programs like Residence Life, HONS, or Campus Center staff, etc.

Students must submit:

- A 500 word personal statement outlining why you want to be an ISP leader, how you would like to grow as an
 ISP leader and contribute to the program, and how your Smith experience so far has prepared you to take on
 that role for your fellow international students.
- Personal Resume (The Lazarus Center has resources to help with this, if needed!)
- This ISP Leader Application Form
